

## WELCOME LETTER

Dear Build from Within Members and Friends

We are beyond excited to welcome everyone to our 13th Build from Within Convening in beautiful Anchorage Alaska. This convening has always been a time for our members to come together with purpose and learn from each other. It is an opportunity to get technical information on that what has worked for the Alliance so far. And perhaps most importantly, it is a chance to draw new energy and new strength for our shared work. There are so many of you out there working hard and moving mountains. The convening reminds us that we are not alone in our mission, that we do this work together, and that we each have so much to share.

This year's Anchorage Convening is special for a couple reason. Most obviously, who doesn't have Alaska on their traveler's bucket list? But this place also has specific relevance to our current and future work as an Alliance. Our approach focuses deliberately on the importance of advancing racial and economic equity through community development. Alaska has the highest rate of Native populations of any state. And Anchorage has the greatest proportion of Native peoples among places with over 100,000 residents. By learning about the rich history of Alaska's Indigenous people and hearing from local Indigenous leaders, we will deepen and broaden this equity work.

As many of you know, this work happens at the level of the individual—the local entrepreneur. But the broader context of this work is what makes community wide change possible. This means scaling our model on both the local and the national level though intentional partnerships and mission driven economic development in our communities. Anchorage Community Land Trust has been committed to community economic development work long before they were an Alliance member. For this reason, they have so much to teach us about strategies and partnerships that transform communities and create new opportunities for entrepreneurs.

We are excited to be together in Anchorage with each of you and your travel companions. And we are grateful for our hosts Anchorage Community Land Trust, their many community partners and for each of our members.

**The 26 Glacier Cruise** Cliffside Marina, 100 W Camp Rd,

#### Limited to those of you who registered and paid for this cruise!

The **26** Glacier Cruise departs from Whittier to explore the calm waters and wild sights of Alaska's Prince William Sound. Discover glacier-carved fjords and pristine wilderness around every turn. Watch for marine wildlife and migratory birds along the way. Travel in comfort aboard safe, modern high-speed catamarans.

Prince William Sound boasts one of the world's largest concentrations of tidewater glaciers. **College and Harriman Fjords** provide an impressive panoramic view of these spectacular glaciers flowing down from the mountains to the saltwater. As the Captain navigates a path through the ice-filled waters, watch the dynamic tidewater glaciers closely as massive chunks of ice can calve (break off) at any moment and crash to the sea with a thunderous sound.

Marine wildlife and migratory birds easily outnumber people in Prince William Sound, so the odds are good that you will see a lot more than glaciers on our cruises! Sea otters are a common sight, along with harbor seals, Bald eagles, and kittiwakes. There are five species of wild Alaska salmon in the Sound. When the fish are in, the whales and bears will follow! It is not uncommon to see orca whales, humpback whales, sea lions, black bears, mountain goats, Dall's porpoise, and migratory birds on our 26 Glacier Cruise.
